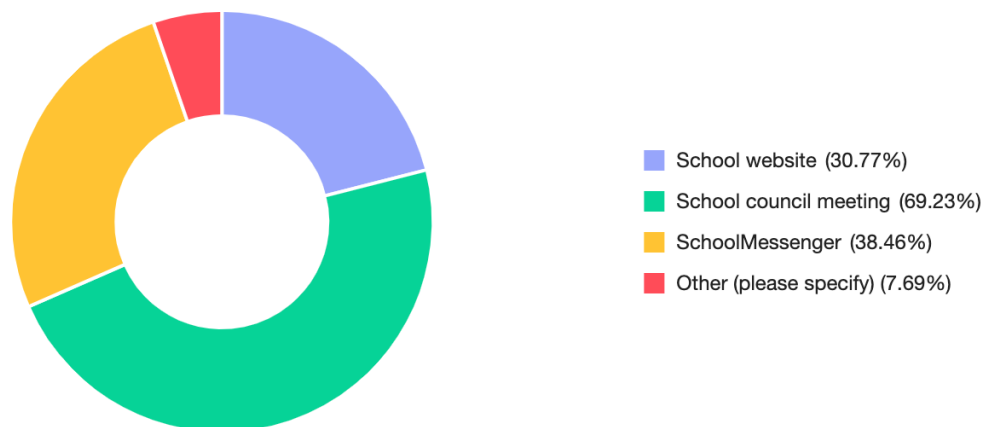
Thank you to everyone who participated in our school planning engagement. We know we make better decisions to support student learning when we build understanding and work together.

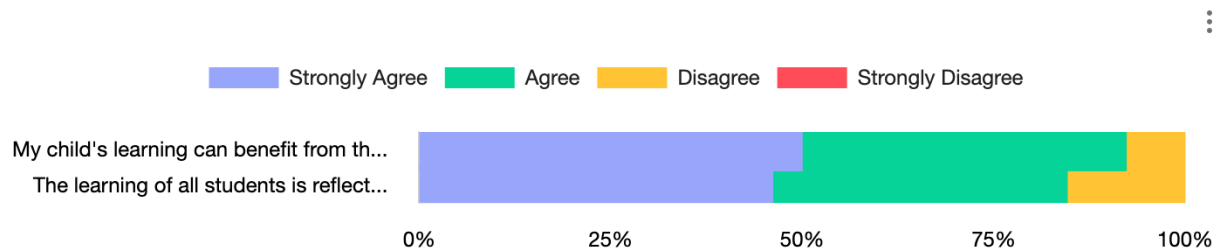


SchoolMessenger showed the highest proportion of "Strongly Agree" responses regarding benefiting students' learning from the SDP, suggesting this communication avenue is highly effective. However, "School council meeting" had a larger total

response volume, potentially highlighting broader engagement but less concentrated agreement.

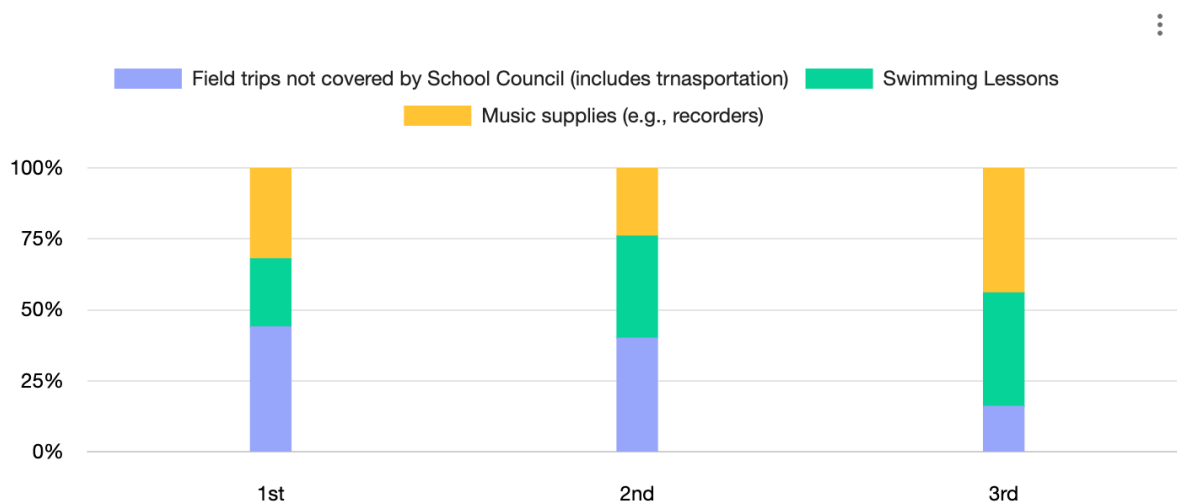

Higher focus on STEM

- I believe that more focus should be put on the teachers and how they are spending their time in the classroom
- I don't love the idea that writing has been defined as what creates engagement. It seems like there are a lot more opportunities and a broader idea needed to increase engagement:
- I am wondering why there is only one SDP goal. Where is mathematics reflected in the SDP? How are you ensuring resources such as UFLI are being used across the school including in kindergarten? How is writing included in kindergarten?

Field trips not covered by the School Council received the highest priority overall, indicating strong support for experiential learning opportunities.

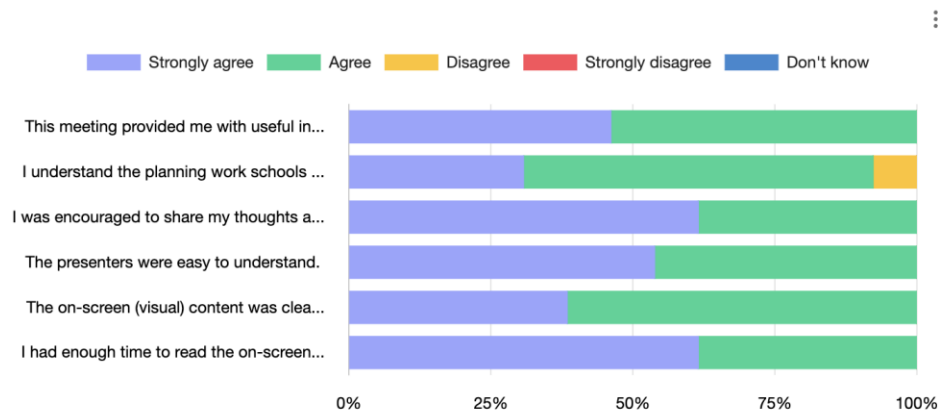
Any other thoughts:
